FALSE - there are 236 episodes
10. Queen Elizabeth II was the second-longest-reigning British monarch  
FALSE - Queen Elizabeth II became the longest-reigning British monarch on 9 September 2015 when she surpassed the reign of her great-great-grandmother Victoria
11. Singer Billie Eilish's full name is Billie Eilish Pirate Baird O'Connell  
TRUE
12. Mount Fuji is the highest mountain in Japan  
TRUE
13. The blue whale is the biggest animal to have ever lived.

14. The total length of the Great Wall of China adds up to 13,171 miles.  
TRUE - that distance is half the length of the equator.
15. There are more countries in South America than Africa.

FALSE - the largest internal organ in the body is the liver (the skin is the largest overall).
